


- Only 31% of women gave birth without medical intervention (active management of the third stage of labor was not considered an intervention) – thus labour is very medicated.
- Almost half of births at the second stage of labor have taken place in the position of women lying on their back.
- Only 49% of women were psychologically satisfied with their birth experience.

Which processes or the following interventions did you have while you gave a birth?



- Induction of labor (getting labor going pitocin, misoprostol etc.) 17.2%
- Breaking the amniotic sac (artificial rupture of membranes) 52.5%
- Freedom of movement/ position 45.5%
- Electronic fetal monitoring 30.3%
- Pain Medication/ Pain Relief Methods 12.1%
- Augmentation of labor (speeding labor up pitocin etc.) 42.4%
- Planned cesarean section 2%
- Cesarean section during labor (emergency or otherwise) 14.1%
- Other interventions 34.3%
- None of the above interventions 12.1%

"THE BRAKES" OF THE PRIMAL HEALTH CONTINUUM:

- in Pregnancy: "prenatal scare (not care)"
- (- Ibu Robin Lim), medicalized pregnancy;
- in Birth process: human speech, light and if a woman feels, she is observed and she's in an insecure situation/place;
- **in Breastfeeding:** no disturbing a mother, no separation a baby from mother, no cutting umbilical cord at least within first 2 hours, no losing colostrum, no dummy.

Ways to the new birth paradigm/primal health paradigm




- Level 1. Medical institutions and organizations of midwives and doulas:
- to change the vocabulary and the language of communication with a woman in childbirth (including avoiding the terms "labour management", "pregnancy management") towards a very respectful and caring attitude to a woman's feelings and her family.
- Level 2. International organizations & Ministries of Health of countries worldwide:
- to put into practice studying and training medical personnel in the Basic Needs of Women and the Child in Labor and in the early postpartum on the basis of the brochure of Ruth Ehrhardt "The Basic Needs of a Woman in Labor".
- Level 3. All future and current parents, midwives, doulas, specialists in obstetric care and the perinatal sphere:
- to start thinking not in terms of an individual or an organization, but in terms of the human species and humanity.

Our basic needs in childbirth coincide with the basic needs of other mammals!




Gilded wood statuette of Isis breastfeeding infant Horus. From the Treasure of Tutankhamun.




Diana's Fountain of Ephesus (Lactation Diva), by

Black Madonna. Arbore tribe. South Ethiopia, 21st century




